Instruction on the Celebrations of the 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas

This year, the 4th Sunday of Advent falls on Christmas Eve. As you are anticipating scheduling your parish Masses, please be advised that:

DECEMBER 24th SUNDAY - FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT {violet} 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16/Romans 16:25-27/Luke 1:26-38 (11) Psalms IV

NB: All Masses in the morning of December 24th are for the Fourth Sunday of Advent.

DECEMBER 25th MONDAY - THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD (Christmas) {white} Solemnity [Holyday of Obligation]

- <u>Vigil:</u> Isaiah 62:1-5/Acts 13:16-17, 22-25/Matthew 1:1-25 or 1:18-25 (13)
- Night: Isaiah 9:1-6/Titus 2:11-14/Lk 2:1-14 (14) Dawn: Is 62:11-12/Titus 3:4-7/Luke 2:15-20 (15)
- <u>Day:</u> Isaiah 52:7-10/Hebrews 1:1-6/John 1:1-18 or 1:1-5, 9-14 (16) Psalms Proper

NB: All Masses in the evening of December 24th are the Vigil for Christmas (Nativity of the Lord – either the Vigil or Night). No Christmas Vigil Mass can be scheduled any earlier than 4:00 p.m. According to the "Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar", there cannot be more Christmas Vigil Masses than Masses on Christmas Day.

The Baptism of the Lord	Tuesday, January 9, 2018 Funeral Masses permitted		
Ash Wednesday	Wednesday, February 14, 2018 Day of Fast and Abstinence Funeral Masses permitted		
Easter Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday	March 29, 30, 31, 2018 Funeral and Ritual Masses not permitted on these days
