

### From Christendom to Apostolic Mission

- Very little literature on intersection between faith and everyday life before ~1980
- Today: many books, organizations, institutes
  - Very few Catholic
- Prevalent presupposition today: chasm between faith and secular life
  - People of faith must challenge this presupposition

# Probably no surprise to you



Depression, Anxiety, Suicide rate, Substance Dependency Belief in God, Participation in an organized religion, Sacraments, Vocations, Donations, Infrastructure

Business results: lower productivity, "quiet quitting," turnover

<u>Spiritual results</u>: spiritual lethargy, loss of faith, embracing of new age spirituality or Gospel of Prosperity



# UTG at Work is here to help

- At all levels of the organization
  - Associate, Leader, Owner/CEO
- Without creating division
  - Better to light a candle than to curse the darkness
- But with conviction
  - The silent majority is at risk of no longer being a majority at all

# Analogy of the Church

#### Parishioners

Called to live a life of holiness.

Instruct parishioners with clarity and conviction within context of Church teaching.

Priests

Bishops

Assure that systems and structures in diocese are sufficient for supporting priests and parishioners in their journey.



# Increasing responsibility

- Priests instruct parishioners how to live a holy
   life but must also live as they instruct them.
- **Bishops** provide support systems but must also support priests in their role and live a holy life.

Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.

- Luke 12:48




## **Business Model**
