
SOLEMN EASTER VIGIL MASS

April 16, 2022



"O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to earth, and divine to the human."

The Exultet

On this night's Vigil, which is the greatest and most noble of all Solemnities, the Church celebrates the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. There are four parts to this celebration: the lighting of the Easter Fire, and the Easter Proclamation and the Exultet as the first part.

The second part is the Liturgy of the Word, when the Church meditates on the wonders that the Lord God has done for His People from the beginning.

As the Mass continues, in the third part, new members are reborn in Baptism. At the completion of Baptism, the Faithful stand with lighted candles to renew their own Baptismal Promises. The Sacrament of Confirmation will also be administered at this time.

The fourth part of this celebration is the Church calling all to the table of the Lord, what He has prepared for His people, the Holy Eucharist.

The Liturgy begins with the blessing of the Fire and the Lighting of the Paschal Candle. The Lucenarium (Service of Light) follows.

CELEBRATION OF CONFIRMATION

THE EFFECTS OF CONFIRMATION (Catechism of the Catholic Church)

1302 It is evident from its celebration that the effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost.

1303 From this fact, Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace:

- it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!";
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect;
- it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross.





THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

1322 The holy Eucharist completes Christian initiation. Those who have been raised to the dignity of the royal priesthood by Baptism and configured more deeply to Christ by Confirmation participate with the whole community in the Lord's own sacrifice by means of the Eucharist.

1323 "At the Last Supper, on the night he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood. This he did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and so to entrust to his beloved Spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal banquet 'in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us." (Saint Thomas Aquinas)


