
The Eucharist Revival, which is occurring across the country, is a three-year grassroots effort to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord.

Trusting in the Holy Spirit

From teaching volunteers in parishes how to effectively minister to those who are grieving to tips on engaging youth and young adults in the faith, Christ's Mission Appeal dollars are at work. A wide variety of offerings from the Diocese of Saginaw are available to parish leaders and staff, parish members and those interested in becoming Catholic.

Some of these include marriage preparation and enrichment, learning meaningful ministry to the sick and homebound, training for leaders of youth preparing for

the Sacraments and of Order of Christian Initiation for Adults or OCIA (formerly Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults or RCIA) and instruction for Eucharist Ministers of Holy Communion. This past year, the diocesan Office of Parish Life and Evangelization conducted an Enrichment Day for people from throughout the Diocese to learn, and in turn take their knowledge back to their individual parishes.

Nourished by the Eucharist



Just as all other Catholic dioceses and archdioceses across the United States, the Catholic Diocese of Saginaw is putting great emphasis on the Eucharist Revival. In the inaugural year of the three-year national movement, the Diocese of Saginaw will focus on parish-level training and events to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord through devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Much of those efforts from a diocesan level will be supported by Christ's Mission Appeal.

The Appeal also helps to fund the livestreaming of daily and Sunday Mass from the Cathedral of Mary of the Assumption and other special liturgies. The livestreaming enables hundreds of people who are unable to attend Mass in-person the opportunity to participate in the liturgy and make a "Spiritual Communion."

The Appeal also was important in the work that was done and continues at the Diocese of Saginaw level for Synod 2023: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission" convoked by Pope Francis in October 2021, Training for Synod leaders in the diocese's 56 parishes, assistance with hosting Synod listening sessions with parish members, students and community members took place. The results of those sessions brought about broad concerns and opinions as well as awareness of issues at parish levels. Cooperation with diocesan departments and parish leadership are developing to resolve those
