### Oct. 6/7

## 27<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time

#### "So the Lord God formed out of the ground various wild animals and various birds of the air, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them; whatever the man called each of them would be its name." Genesis 2:19

The creation story brings two points to mind. The first is that God put the entire world in our care; and second, that stewardship isn't something new. It was not invented by the modern Church. Faith is believing in something even though you may not be able to see it. Bartimaeus, the blind man, believed in Jesus, even though he could not see Him. He had faith without seeing. Sometimes it takes more than sight to recognize God's active presence in our lives.
