PROCURATORS CHECKLIST

As a procurator, it is your responsibility to submit all necessary documents. The following is a checklist to this end:
The Petition signed in appropriates places by the Petitioner and Procurator The Petitioner's testimony must be in "first person" form with every page initialed and the last page signed and dated
 Make sure they answer all the questions on the questionnaire giving lots of detai and examples
 Go over their testimony with them, if you see anything that you feel needs to be expanded on please ask questions that will help them to give more details The Respondent contact information; Church law requires that we <u>must</u> make every
 effort to contact the respondent If an address cannot be acquired then an explanation must be provided to the Tribunal as to why that is so and what steps were taken to locate the Petitioner's former spouse.
• The Tribunal will cite the Respondent directly regarding this process so no contact is necessary between the Petitioner and the Respondent
 If for some very serious reason, the Respondent should not be contacted attach a separate letter explaining this situation.
Correct addresses for the witnesses, proper title noted, i.e., Mr., Ms. No children of the parties are to be witnesses
 It is essential that 3-4 witnesses be provided. Witnesses are persons who knew the spouses during their courtship and marriage and thus may be able to offer insight as to why a given marriage has failed. Witnesses may include parents, relatives, or close friends of the couple. The party submitting the witnesses' names should notify them that they will be contacted by the tribunal.
You should also submit the following documents:
A copy of the marriage license
A complete copy of the divorce decree or its equivalent
If the Petitioner is Catholic, a recent (issued within the last 6 months) baptismal certificate or if a convert, a profession of faith certificate with all notations
Complete the Procurator/Advocate's comments, assessing the Petitioner's circumstance character, and credibility. Your observations and evaluations assist the Court in understanding the context of the information provided.
Remember: If the Petitioner or Respondent changes addresses during the time of the
